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REACH impact assessments

Caleb has a procedure and purpose-designed software for conducting REACH impact assessments; the following is a summary of the key reasons for conducting one and the information that is obtained.

1. Information required

- List of pre-registered substances with CAS and/or EC numbers
- Either (a) product formulations (including substance composition by percentage) and product tonnages or (b) substance tonnages. For products or substances, tonnages should be available by year from 2008 onwards, but a three year average for prior years is sufficient)
- List of data already available to the client for filling data gaps per Annexes VII, VIII, IX and X

2. Information derived

- Table of data available and data gaps
- Options for filling data gaps based on read across, groupings or derogations/waivers based on REACH Annex VII, VIII, IX and X defined criteria.
- Estimated costs of filling data gaps based on several assumed scenarios
- ECHA Registration fees/substance
- Total estimated costs of registration/substance (fees + testing costs)
- Total estimated cost of registration for entire product portfolio

3. Reasons for conducting REACH impact assessment

- To derive testing and registration cost estimates for a legal entity
- To derive testing and registration cost estimates for a SIEF/consortium
- To estimate the impact of a substance breaching a tonnage band.
